TERMINALLY ILL ADULTS (END OF LIFE) BILL – YOUR URGENT ACTION IS NEEDED: In November 2024, MPs voted by 330 to 275 to give MP Kim Leadbeater's Terminally Ill Adults (End of Life) Bill a second reading. The Bill is now being scrutinised by a Committee of MPs, followed by Report stage, with MPs given another chance to vote at Third Reading towards the end of April (possibly 25th). IT NEEDS JUST 30 MPS TO CHANGE THEIR VOTE TO DEFEAT THE BILL SO WHAT CAN WE DO? Many MPs have already said that they could change their vote if they are not satisfied with the details of this bill. Even if you have already contacted your MP there is an urgent need to lobby your MP to reject the Bill at Third Reading. You can do this by: Lobbying your MP in person (the most impactful campaign action one can take) Writing to your MP (if you can write a personal letter to your MP this will be more powerful than an email). If your MP voted for the Leadbetter Bill in November, it is especially important that you contact them. During the second reading debate, many MPs said they would change their vote if they weren't satisfied with the safeguards, or if particular changes weren't made. The Lives Worth Living campaign provides lots of resources and advice to help you to understand the Bill and tips for raising your concerns effectively with your MP in person or in writing. Lourdes by Jumbulance: Wirral and Chester Across Groups are again travelling to Lourdes by Jumbulance in 2025. The dates are Thu 15th to Sat 14th May and Thu 14th to Sat 23rd August. The Jumbulance is literally a Jumbo-Ambulance, with seven beds on board, an accessible toilet and kitchen. The journey overland takes about 21 hours. There are vacancies for a Doctor (in May), a nurse on each Group and helpers. There are vacancies for sick and disabled pilgrims. In the past we have taken people with MND, MS, COPD, various cancers, heart disease, etc and we have the facilities to care on the Jumbulance and in the Hotel. The cost is £1,360 which *includes Travel Insurance*. Nurses and those under 25 in FTE are asked to pay £660. Isaiah 43:16-21: Thus says the LORD, who makes a way in the sea, a path in the mighty waters, who brings forth chariot and horse, army and warrior; they lie down, they cannot rise, they are extinguished, quenched like a wick: 'Remember not the former things, nor consider the things of old. Behold, I am doing a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert. The wild beasts will honour me, the jackals and the ostriches, for I give water in the wilderness, rivers in the desert, to give drink to my chosen people, the people whom I formed for myself that they might declare my praise.'

Responsorial Psalm: What great deeds the LORD worked for us! Indeed, we were glad.

Philippians 3:8-14: Brothers and Sisters: I count everything as loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have suffered the loss of all things and count them as rubbish, in order that I may gain Christ and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but that which comes through faith in Christ, the righteousness from God that depends on faith — that I may know him and the power of his resurrection, and may share his sufferings, becoming like him in his death, that by any means possible I may attain the resurrection from the dead. Not that I have already obtained this or am already perfect, but I press on to make it my own, because Christ Jesus has made me his own. Brothers and sisters, I do not consider that I have made it my own. But one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on towards the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus.

Gospel Acclamation: Even now, says the Lord, return to me with all your heart, for I am gracious and merciful.

John 8:1-11: At that time: Jesus went to the Mount of Olives. Early in the morning he came again to the temple. All the people came to him, and he sat down and taught them. The scribes and the Pharisees brought a woman who had been caught in adultery, and placing her in the midst they said to him, 'Teacher, this woman has been caught in the act of adultery. Now in the Law, Moses commanded us to stone such women. So what do you say?' This they said to test him, that they might have some charge to bring against him. Jesus bent down and wrote with his finger on the ground. And as they continued to ask him, he stood up and said to them, 'Let him who is without sin among you be the first to throw a stone at her.' And once more he bent down and wrote on the ground. But when they heard it, they went away one by one, beginning with the older ones, and Jesus was left alone with the woman standing before him. Jesus stood up and said to her, 'Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?' She said, 'No one, Lord.' And Jesus said, 'Neither do I condemn you; go, and from now on sin no more.'
